My focus this month has been on my Science Fiction project, the sequel to 'The War of the Worlds'. (You didn't know I was doing that? Check out my other mailing list then!)

what works and what doesn't. That's a vital part of the process, let me tell you. And I don't notice, because when I get to the part of the book that depends on it, I remember it vividly! Someone who hasn't read it before, of course, sends me an email saying 'err, what?' and I go and fix it.

So there's been a fair bit of editing, not all of it quite that drastic, and some rewriting to do. When your readers say the ending doesn't work for them, it's very wise to listen. Even if it does mean rejigging the final third of the book... and the first third, so it sets up the new final third... And the middle, so they join up...


The sole fact she knows for sure is that someone hurt her. Someone betrayed her. Someone killed her.


I wrote a Doctor Who story for a contest, but sadly I didn't win. I'm still proud of the story though, so I've decided to give it away!
